“...Christ was the first one raised from the dead with a resurrection body as the firstfruit from the dead (I Cor.15:20). . .At the end of the church age the rapture of the church will take place and the dead in Christ will be raised. At the end of the tribulation, the tribulation saints will also be raised from the dead. It would seem clear from these facts that the term “the first resurrection” is not an event but an order of resurrection including all the righteous who are raised from the dead before the millennial kingdom begins.

They are “first” in contrast to those who are raised last, after the millennium, when the wicked dead are raised and judged. .Just as there are two kinds of physical death, namely, the first death which results in burial, and the second death which is described as being cast into the lake of fire, so there are two kinds of resurrection, a first resurrection having to do with the resurrection of the righteous, and a second resurrection having to do with the wicked.”

During the Millennium, believers will be free from the evil influence and harassment of Satan. . . they will populate the earth, living in an ideal environment, with King Jesus as their loving, benevolent ruler.
