“How should we live until the Rapture of the Church takes place or until we each see Jesus face-to-face?

First, we should **walk submissively**: ‘keep’ the things we have been shown.(22:7). . . .walk submissively under the authority of God’s Word until Jesus returns - to read it, study it, believe it, and obey it. . . .to transform our thinking and direct our daily lives.

Second, we should **worship triumphantly**: just as John’s response to prophetic events is to worship

Third, we should **witness urgently**: ‘because the time is near’.(22:10)

Fourth, we should **work fervently**: we have only a short time on this earth in which to serve Him so whatever we can do for Him – whatever He has called us to do – we need to do it now!” (22:12)
